I. <u>Welcome</u>

David Pulay welcomed the AMATS Citizens Involvement Committee (CIC) meeting attendee.

II. Discussion Items

A. Mr. Pulay made a presentation regarding *Transportation Outlook 2045*.

Fred Wise expressed concerns regarding the need by Summit County to preserve right of way (ROW) on Everett Road in Akron for cycling needs. The attendees discussed Mr. Wise's concerns.

Austen Rau praised *Transportation Outlook 2045*'s focus on active transportation and Complete Street principles. **Mr. Rau** said that the plan's active transportation project recommendations have lower costs than highway projects, but noted that active transportation projects account for about 0.7 percent of total funding. **Mr. Rau** proposed that the plan's percentage of active transportation projects be increased while maintaining the plan's fiscal constraint.

Mr. Rau asked if there were funding limitations imposed by the federal government or the Ohio Department of Transportation for active transportation projects. **Mr. Pulay** explained that, while there are not actual funding limitations, there are minimum requirements that set amounts of various project funding must be set aside for such purposes. **Mr. Pulay** noted that active transportation projects

such as bike lanes and sidewalks are often components of other projects and not separately funded items. **Mr. Pulay** added that the minimum amounts devoted to such projects can be adjusted by project sponsors to what they deem to be appropriate levels. **Mr. Rau** expressed support for increasing the percentage of funding in the plan devoted to active transportation projects.

Mr. Rau stated that the Veterans Trail in Akron, Cuyahoga Falls, Stow and Hudson as listed in the plan offered the best possible benefit to the greatest number of people in the region and - given its proximity to state Route 8 - represented a potential commuting route.

Ron Brubaker asked why a portion of the Veterans Trail ROW owned by METRO RTA, extending from the Freedom Trail across Arlington Street to the Northside Station in Akron, wasn't included with the two Veterans Trail sections recommended in the plan. **Mr. Pulay** said that he would confer with AMATS Director Curtis Baker regarding the section and reply to Mr. Brubaker via email or telephone. **Mr. Brubaker** expressed support for the section's inclusion in the plan as it would improve accessibility to the Veterans Trail.

Mr. Brubaker asked if the bicycle recommendations listed in Table 7.2-1 | Long-Term Bicycle Recommendations were prioritized. **Mr. Pulay** said that the recommendations were not prioritized. **Darryl Kleinhenz** noted that the recommendations were listed by community.

B. Mr. Pulay made a presentation regarding 2021 AMATS Supplemental Resurfacing Funding.

Mr. Wise asked which community would be responsible for the intersection of Seasons, Wyoga Lake and State roads as the intersection spans the jurisdictions of Boston Township and Cuyahoga Falls. Mr. Wise asked how to begin the process of pursuing an improvement project for the intersection. Mr. Pulay said that a single entity usually assumes the lead in pursuing projects with multijurisdictional overlap. Mr. Pulay said that the lead entity in such situations is usually the one with the greatest stake in such projects.

William J. Maki stated that he relayed correspondence to Cuyahoga Falls Engineer Tony Demasi suggesting that the Seasons, Wyoga Lake and State road intersection could be converted to a traffic circle.

Messrs. Pulay and **Kleinhenz** agreed to install one of the agency's MioVision cameras to monitor traffic at the intersection. **Mr. Pulay** noted that the Seasons, Wyoga Lake and State road intersection scored at #322 in the list of High-Crash Intersections in the AMATS 2017-2019 Traffic Crash Report.

The attendees discussed AMATS' approaches to promote cycling and cycling facilities within the Greater Akron area.

C. Mr. Rau asked for information about AMATS' Bike-N-Brainstorm Program and events. Mr. Rau noted that the city of Cuyahoga Falls has not been the site of

recent Bike-N-Brainstorm events. **Mr. Kleinhenz** explained that AMATS approaches communities to determine their interest in hosting an event. **Mr. Kleinhenz** invited Mr. Rau to contact him regarding organizing an event. **Mr. Rau** indicated that he would do so and expressed support for the goals of the program.

III. Adjournment

There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned.

Please remember projects that are CMAQ eligible support two important goals: improving air quality and relieving congestion. If possible please turn the applications in early since CMAQ scoring requires congestion and air quality improvement analysis.

STBG, Resurfacing, and TASA, applications will follow and be due August 31, 2021. Those applications will also be posted on the AMATS website. The table below is a quick reference to our funding programs. Please let us know if you have any questions.

Executive Summary

The purpose of this resolution is to approve a change to the FY 2022 Transportation Planning Work Program and Budget to include an update to the regional Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) architecture.

The AMATS regional Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Architecture was originally developed for the Akron area in 1999, with an update in July 2004. ITS is an application which aims to provide innovative services relating to different modes of transportation and traffic management and enable different municipalities to be better informed and make safer, more coordinated, and improved use of transportation networks. The purpose of a regional ITS architecture is to provide an overall framework for coordinating the regional deployment of Intelligent Transportation Systems infrastructure and to serve as a resource that can be used by all of the transportation agencies in the Akron-Canton area for solutions to transportation problems such as congestion and safety. The architecture represents a shared vision of how the ITS infrastructure, operated by various agencies, will work together, sharing information and resources to provide a safer, more efficient, and more effective transportation system for travelers.

As part of AMATS ongoing efforts to reduce 2021carryover, AMATS is working with ODOT and Drive Ohio to fund the ITS architecture update. \$90,001 of STBG funding from FY 2021 will be used to fund the project.

Staff Recommendation

Attached is Resolution 2021-10 for your review and consideration. This resolution approves amending the FY 2022 Transportation Planning Work Program and Budget to include the addition of STBG funding to be used to update the regional ITS architecture. The Policy Committee's approval is requested.

The pandemic along with projects that have sold under their estimate have led to a \$5 million surplus of STBG funds in FY 2022. If this occurs, over \$2 million of it would be subject to ODOT recall policies. These circumstances have led AMATS staff and the TAC-TIP Subcommittee to recommend a special round of funding for resurfacing projects.

At the May meeting these projects were presented to you and a request was made to approve the funding. Now that the projects have Project Identification (PID) numbers and federal recognition, the next step is to officially add them to the FY 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program. All the projects shall be programmed to sell in FY 2022. The new projects are listed in the table below.
