II. Discussion Items

A. First Draft Projects List for the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for Fiscal Years 2021 Through 2024. – Attachment 5B

Fred Wise asked about the scheduling of the West Steels Corners Road – Phase 1 resurfacing project (PID #102904) in Fiscal Year 2021 in Draft Table H-3. Mr. Wise expressed concerns as to whether the project's surface area, extending from State Road to Northampton Road in Cuyahoga Falls, would last until next year when the project is scheduled to commence. Mr. Baker explained that, due to balances in the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program, a number of area projects could be rescheduled to earlier construction dates, but he was unaware as to whether the project's sponsor, Cuyahoga Falls, has indicated an interest to do so.

Mr. Wise praised the 2019 Active Transportation Plan, which was approved by the AMATS Policy Committee in December 2019. The attendees discussed the need to address active and alternative forms of transportation in regional planning.

At the January meetings AMATS presented the first draft of highway, transit and bike and pedestrian projects as part of the draft Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for fiscal years 2021-2024. In February, the complete first draft TIP document was submitted to ODOT for review and comment. Since that time, ODOT provided updates to projects and these changes have been incorporated into the attached second draft project listing.

Copies of the complete 2nd draft TIP document, including the project lists, will be submitted to ODOT on March 12th for further review and comment. This draft will also be used for a two-week public involvement period beginning on March 30th and ending April 10th.

As part of the TIP public involvement process, AMATS will host a TIP public meeting on April 2nd at 6:30 pm at the downtown Akron Public Library. Any comments received during this public involvement period will be presented at the Policy Committee meeting in May, when approval of the FY 2021-2024 TIP is expected.

After Policy Committee approval, the TIP will then be officially submitted to ODOT, the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration for final approval, which is expected by the end of June. The FY 2021-2024 TIP will then be active at the start of the fiscal year in July.

Statewide Line Items

Projects that meet certain criteria are not required to be listed in Table H-3 of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) but still need to be recognized in the TIP. They may be grouped together by work type and/or geographic location and listed as statewide line items (SLI's). Table H-4 is the current list and descriptions of the SLI's that are included in the 2021-2024 TIP. These projects all utilize federal funds but are not funded directly through AMATS funding sources.

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) provided the list of line item projects that need to be included in the 2021-2024 TIP. In most cases they are the project sponsor. This list provides important information to our transportation partners and well as the general public about projects scheduled during the TIP period. The use of statewide line items will significantly decrease the need for TIP amendments and provide more flexibility in the various programs.

When utilizing a statewide line item, the criteria below should be followed and met.

- Projects considered for a statewide line item must meet the following criteria:
 - Not regionally significant
 - o Air quality status of exempt
 - o Environmental document type of CE 2 or below
 - o Non-capacity adding
 - o Consistent with ODOT's and AMATS transportation plans
- An individual project utilizing a statewide line item does not require an amendment.
 However when a category of projects reaches a defined threshold then an amendment is required for that category.
- When requesting the use of a statewide line item on a phase of a project, the ODOT
 District is to coordinate the request with the Program Manager, AMATS, and the STIP
 Coordinator. Ellis will be updated by the STIP Coordinator.

Executive Summary

This memorandum discusses a TIP amendment to the FY 2020 program of projects for METRO RTA and PARTA to add several projects.

Annually, the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) in coordination with the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA), offers funds from the Diesel Emissions Reduction Grant (DERG) Program to public and private sector diesel fleets (motor vehicle, marine, locomotive and highway construction equipment) that are eligible under the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ).

On January 24, 2020, PARTA was awarded funds through the DERG program for inclusion in FY 2020 of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Consequently, PARTA is requesting that these additional funds be added to the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include two large clean diesel buses. These funds will be used for the maintenance of PARTA's bus fleet.

METRO and PARTA are also requesting that two other projects be added to FY 2020 of the TIP for the maintenance of their capital assets.

PARTA is requesting the following changes to the TIP:

- Add Capital Funds for the Purchase of Two Large Diesel Buses (PID 112319)

PARTA has been awarded \$703,038 in state-attributable CMAQ funds through the DERG Program and requests the purchase of two large (35-foot) diesel buses in FY 2020. The project will be matched with thirty percent local funds (\$301,302). The total cost for this new project is \$1,004,340.

- Add Capital Funds for the Purchase of One Large Diesel Bus (PID 112479)

PARTA requests the addition of \$415,139 in FTA Section 5307 Urban Area Formula funds for the purchase of one large (35-foot) diesel bus in FY 2020. The total project cost is \$518,924. Funds will be issued at 80% federal share, with the local matching amount of \$103,785.

METRO is requesting the following changes to the TIP:

- Add Capital Funds for Building Maintenance and Rehabilitation of the Downtown Akron Transit Center (PID 112804)

METRO requests the addition of \$158,000 in FTA Section 5339 Bus & Bus Facilities Program funds for the installation of new siding for the downtown Akron transit center, to be programmed in FY 2020. Funds will be issued at 80% federal share, with a local matching amount of \$39,500. The total cost for this new project is \$197,500.

STAFF COMMENTS

As with all TIP amendments, considerations with respect to consistency with the Regional Transportation Plan, financial capability, air quality conformity, public involvement, and environmental justice are important.

Regional Transportation Plan

The project proposed in this amendment is consistent with *Transportation Outlook*, the area's Regional Transportation Plan.

Financial Capability

With respect to financial capability, there are sufficient funds available for this amendment.

Air Quality

The project can be viewed as either exempt from air quality or has been analyzed as part of the air quality networks and has resulted in a finding of compliance with the Clean Air Act. Therefore, this amendment will not affect adversely the air quality conformity approval of *Transportation Outlook* or the TIP.

Public Involvement

The Staff is recommending that the Policy Committee consider this action as not regionally significant. As a result, the modified procedures in the AMATS *Public Participation Plan* are appropriate.

Environmental Justice

Executive Order 12898: Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low Income Populations states that, "each federal agency shall make achieving environmental justice part of its mission by identifying and addressing as appropriate, disproportionately high and adverse human health or environmental effects of its programs policies and activities on minority

and low-income populations." This requirement also applies to recipients of federal funds, such as METRO RTA and PARTA.

The project that will result from this TIP amendment does not appear to impose disproportionately high and adverse human health or environmental effects on minorities and/or low-income people who reside in the METRO RTA or PARTA service areas.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Attached to this memo is Resolution 2020-03. This resolution approves the requested changes to FY 2020 of the TIP as described above. The Staff recommends approval.

Add The Following Projects to the FY 2018-2021 TIP

1. **East Ave** – Is a project in the City of Tallmadge to add a center two way left turn lane with new curbs and sidewalks from Community Rd to the Portage County Line. Engineering is scheduled in FY 2020 using \$1,984,500 of federal and state Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funds.

- 2. **S. Van Buren Ave and W. Waterloo Rd** Is a resurfacing project in the City of Barberton. Originally these were two separate projects but have been combined into one because of their proximity to each other and for economies of scale. Construction is scheduled in FY 2020 using \$615,976 of STBG funds.
- 3. **IR 77-24.12 (Ghent Rd to Everett Rd)** Is a widening project in Bath Township to add an additional lane in each direction. The engineering is scheduled in FY 2020 using \$1,600,000 of federal funds and \$400,000 of state funds.
- 4. **IR 77-28.75 (Everett Rd to Ohio Turnpike)** Is a widening project in Richfield and Richfield Township to add an additional lane in each direction. The engineering is scheduled in FY 2020 using \$3,200,000 of federal funds and \$800,000 of state funds.

STAFF COMMENTS
